re-enactments including the most famous event in Deadwood's history – the shooting of Wild Bill Hickok and the trial of Jack McCall.

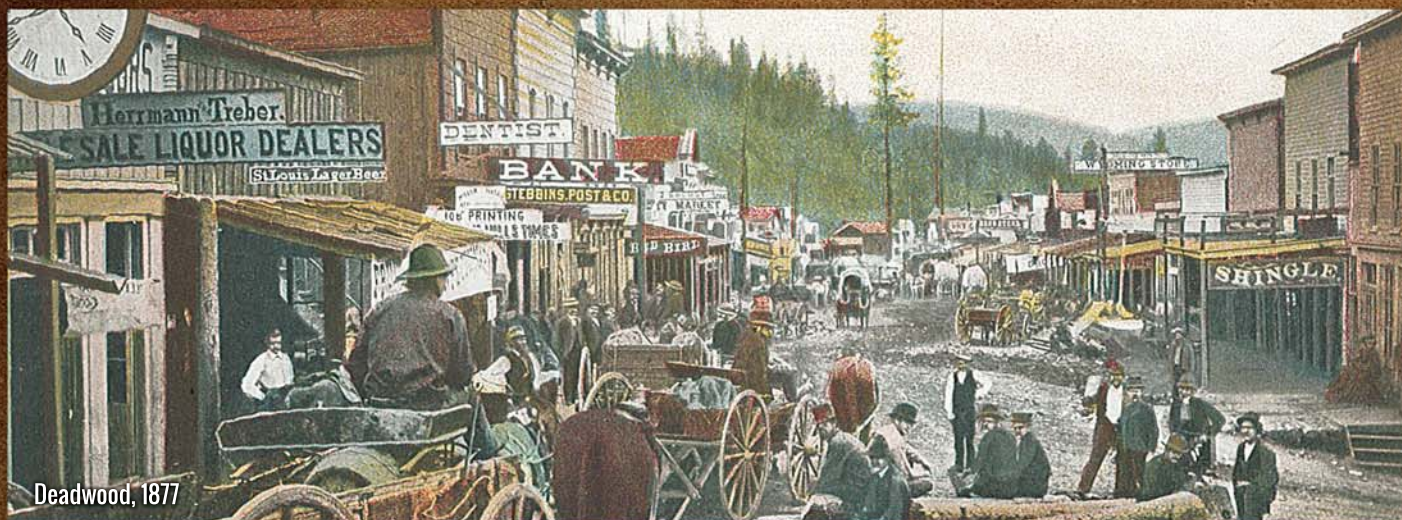

## TEA AND TOUR OF THE HISTORIC ADAMS HOUSE

The meticulously restored 1892 Queen Anne-style home with original contents chronicles Deadwood's transition from a raucous mining camp into a prosperous and technologically rich city. Discover the triumphs and tragedies of two of Deadwood's founding families. The Victorian home was built by pioneer businessman Harris Franklin, complete with stained glass windows, thoroughly modern 19th century plumbing and electricity, hand-painted canvas wall coverings, and telephone service. W.E. Adams purchased the home in 1920, and after his death in 1934, Adams' second wife Mary closed the doors. Visitors are treated to tea and cookies, only available through this tour.

## ARCHAEOLOGICAL COLLECTIONS OF DEADWOOD: AN ETHNIC OASIS

Deadwood's historic preservation efforts are considered one of the best in the Nation. Our rich heritage includes not only the myths and realities of Deadwood's legendary characters and its remarkable architecture but one of the largest collections of Chinese artifacts in the American West. Over 400,000 artifacts provide insight into the daily life of pioneers during the wild mining camp days with an emphasis on Deadwood's Chinatown at the turn of the 19th century, revealing the history of Deadwood from the discovery of gold in 1876 until the 1920s.

Visitors are treated to a guided walking tour of this National Historic Landmark's history and a behind the scenes tour of the Historic Preservation Archival and Archaeological collections at Deadwood City Hall including meeting the curator of the collections.

## MINER'S MORNING



Be the first to tour the Broken Boot Gold Mine in the morning, complete with a Miner's Breakfast consisting of a world-famous pastie! Hear how it was to be a miner back in the 1800s and what challenges

they faced, as you tour the 19th century Broken Boot Gold Mine. Practice gold panning at the Broken Boot, then head to the Deadwood Welcome Center for a creek-side experience on how placer miners found gold on Whitewood Creek!
