

Historic Deadwood EXPERIENTIAL TOURS

HISTORIC ADAMS HOUSE AND MOUNT MORIAH CEMETERY TOUR

Fans of history, architecture, and historic cemeteries will tour the Historic Adams House and Mount Moriah Cemetery. The Adams House is an 1892 Queen Anne-style historic home with oak interiors, hand-painted canvas wall coverings, stained glass windows, thoroughly modern 19th century plumbing, electricity, and telephone service. Built by Harris and Anna Franklin, visitors will relive the triumphs and tragedies of two of Deadwood's founding families. W.E. Adams purchased the home in 1920, and after his death in 1934, Adams' second wife, Mary, closed the doors leaving all of the original contents intact.

Be sure to leave your boots on when you board Boot Hill Tours to visit Deadwood's famous Boot Hill: Mount Moriah Cemetery. See the graves of Wild Bill Hickok, Calamity Jane, Potato Creek Johnny, Madam Dora DuFran, Seth Bullock, and other graves of Deadwood's famous and infamous characters. Our trip through the cemetery will include such points of interest as the


Chinese section, Potters Fields, Hebrew Hill where Harris and Anna Franklin are buried, a memorial stone to W.E. Adams, and a Civil War veterans section. As we travel through the cemetery, riders will have a bird's-eye view of Deadwood and the Homestake Mine shaft. The tour is narrated by long-time Black Hills residents and historians and includes a multimedia presentation with historic photos and music.

Experience the mine the way prospectors did over 100 years ago, by candle light. This tour offers a unique perspective not available at any other mine or cave tours in the region. Each guest uses a battery powered candle to light their way. An experienced tour guide will lead you underground and into a real, historic mine. You'll learn about the mine's history and the methods used to extract the precious metal. Be sure to arrive no later than 5pm if you would like a gold panning lesson. Additional fees apply.

Hit the creek for a private lesson in gold mining! Hear stories of the first miners in Deadwood, back when the lure of striking it rich drew thousands of gold seekers in the 1800s. We can't guarantee you'll find your fortune, but you'll learn the ways of working a creek!

TEA AND TOUR OF THE HISTORIC ADAMS HOUSE

Glimpse into Deadwood's past as a tour guide dressed in elegant 1920s apparel escorts you through the home where two of Deadwood's influential founding families lived. The meticulously restored 1892 Queen Anne-style home with original contents chronicles Deadwood's transition from a raucous mining camp into a prosperous and technologically rich city. The Victorian home was built by pioneer businessman Harris Franklin, complete with stained glass windows, thoroughly modern 19th century plumbing and electricity, hand-painted canvas wall coverings, and telephone service. W.E. Adams purchased the home in 1920, and after his death in 1934, Adams' second wife, Mary, closed the doors. Visitors are treated to tea and cookies, only available through this tour.

Cost: \$15pp Minimum: 10 | Maximum: 20 Approximate length: 75 minutes Call 605-722-4800 to book this tour.

LAWMAN'S PATROL: GUIDED WALKING TOUR



Patrol the streets of Historic Deadwood with one of the town's first lawmen. He will guide you through time on this multi-stop walking tour of a National Historic Landmark. You'll learn about the discovery of gold, brothels and bars, the town's unique architecture and the massive destruction caused by fire and flood.

Cost: \$15pp Minimum: 2 | Maximum: 20 Approximate length: 45 minutes to 1 hour Availability: Memorial Day weekend to mid-Sept. Monday through Saturday (not available on Sundays). Off-season: Mid-March to end of May and mid-Sept. to mid-Nov. tours Friday & Saturday.
