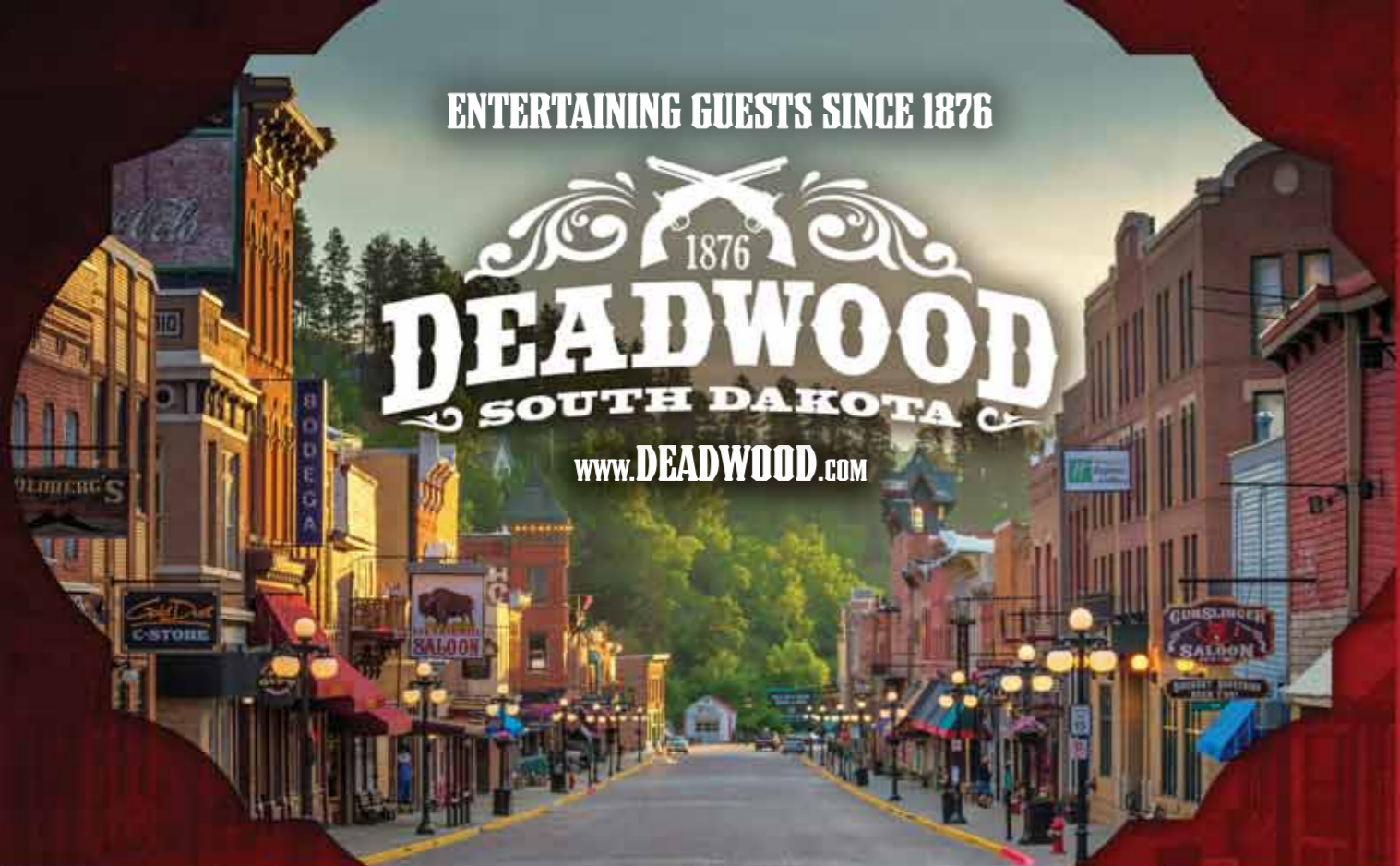

famous events in Deadwood's history – the shooting of Wild Bill Hickok and the Trial of Jack McCall.

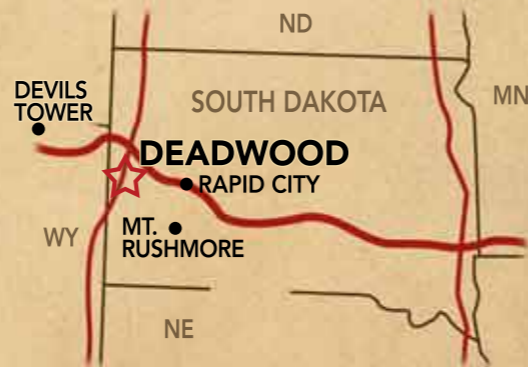
